Syllabus



Course Description:

The 6th grade Drama Class will last nine weeks and will give the student a basic overview of the subject. Students will gain an understanding for appropriate audience behavior and rehearsal etiquette. Exploring terminology, stagecraft, vocal skills, and stage movement will take a hands-on approach. Students will also use their skills learned to perform a “Readers Theater” for an audience. Parents are invited to attend the performance. Watch for the date, time, and place in the Agenda Book.

Major Course Projects and Assignments: Instructional Philosophy:

Drama courses are aimed at providing students with life-long skills including collaboration techniques and opportunities, a sense of responsibility to the production and their fellow students, and an accountability to their audience, peers, and teachers. We promote that drama is fun as an actor, director, designer, or whatever role is assigned. Students will leave the classroom with an appreciation for the performing arts and its place in the community. Ultimately, through drama, students will develop confidence in their abilities and talents that they have to offer and know that their contributions aid in the success of productions.

Standard 3: Performance - Students will identify and apply artistic concepts, knowledge, and skills to communicate through theatrical productions and presentations.

Components of the Grade:

Rubrics will be used to grade each project. Rubrics vary according to the assignment.

Opportunities for Extra Help and Re-Doing Work:

A time for extra help can be set up before school, after school, or by appointment with the teacher.

Re-Do opportunities will vary according to nature of the assignment. Generally, students may redo classroom/homework assignments until meeting proficiency. Production Assignments cannot be re-done.

Class Guidelines:

1. **Be Prepared to Learn.** Have assignments completed, bring all materials to class, and stay on task during class.
2. **Respect Property.** Proper care will be taken of classroom, costumes, set, makeup, and facilities.
3. **Respect Others.** Treat others as you like to be treated. Zero tolerance for put-downs.
4. **Don't Irritate the Teacher.** Don't complicate my ability to teach or another student's ability to learn.

Consequences/Restitution:

1. Verbal Warning.
2. Refocus, Grounding, Student/Teacher conference during class or after school and **30 minutes community service.**
3. Parent contact and **60 minutes community service.**
4. Sent to office, **P.A.S.S. Room day**, and may be removed from the class.

Tardy Policy:

- 1st Tardy = Warning
- For each additional tardy a 30 minute community will be served.
- At the 6th tardy a P.A.S.S. Room day will be assigned.
